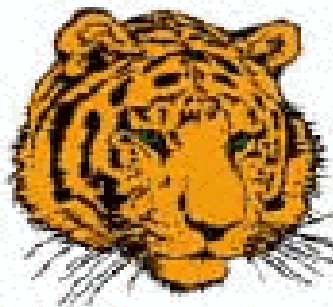

PTA President's Letter

Spring has Sprung! It doesn't happen officially for a few more days yet, but longer days and warm sunny weather sure make it feel that way.

With the coming of spring, our PTA nominating committee goes into high gear. Elections for next year's officers will be held at our April PTA meeting and parent education evening on April 16th. Several important officer and committee chair positions remain to be filled. See the article elsewhere in this issue for more details about how you can get involved.

PTA supports Terman in many different ways, but one of the most visible ways is through the "stuff" we donate to the school. Earlier this year, PTA contributed \$20,000 to purchase 20 laptops for teacher use. I am happy to report that during our recent mid-year budget review, we decided to allocate an additional \$16,500 to technology, to be spent on memory upgrades for the machines in the computer lab and 18 digital projectors, enough so that every classroom will now be equipped with this technology. This is possible due to parent generosity in our direct appeal campaign as well as excess carryover funds remaining from last year. Work on upgrading the audio systems in the café is continuing as well.

Another tangible way that PTA makes a difference is our educational grants program, coordinated by Nancy Marcotte. The second round of grants for this academic year was awarded recently and included funds for:

- A book repair machine to extend the usable life of library books and textbooks.
- Easels, palettes, and palette knives to be used for acrylic paints in art classes.
- 40 Dictionaries.
- Materials for teaching social skills to autistic children.
- Supplementary workbooks for 7th grade Social Studies.
- Math manipulatives and books.
- Special Education equipment including flash cards, timers, and squeeze balls.

You won't want to miss two upcoming PTA-sponsored parent education opportunities. On April 9, Madeline Levine, author of *The Price of Privilege* and nationally known authority on fostering resilience in our children, will be speaking at Gunn. And on April 16, Dr. Philippe Rey, executive director of Adolescent Counseling Services, will be speaking here at Terman on the topic of "Talking Sex and other difficult topics with Teens." If you are surprised (and maybe a little alarmed) by your young adolescent's developing interest in the opposite sex, this is your chance to get your questions answered. See the announcements elsewhere in this issue for more details about these events.

As always, we welcome your questions, comments, and participation in Terman PTA. Enjoy your Spring Break!

From the Assistant Principal....

Spring is quickly approaching with warmer weather. Parents, we ask that you take time to review your student's wardrobe with them. Middle School students tend to grow over the winter and many of them outgrow their clothes without realizing it. Please check page 41 of the Parent Handbook for guidelines on dress code.

The Terman dress code expects students to come dressed for school to participate in their learning, with clothes that fit comfortably and do not provide a distraction, are safe and promote a positive image.

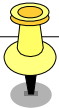
- * Shirts need to keep the midriff covered. That means midriff remains covered when arms go above the head.
- * Pants and skirts need to have a waistline high enough to help keep the midriff covered and be longer than the length of the student's fingertips when arms are extended straight down the side.
- * Shoes need to allow a student to move safely about school.
- * Clothing, including backpacks, binders and jewelry should not contain offensive remarks or logos, including references to alcohol, drugs, cigarettes or sex.

Please review pages 36 - 42 of the Terman Parent Handbook.

When a student is inappropriately dressed they will be asked to change into their gym clothes, or the office can supply Terman T-shirts to anyone wearing an inappropriate article of clothing.

With the warmer weather we hope more students will walk or ride their bicycles to school. If you drive your student(s) to school please review pages 9 - 11 of the Terman Parent Handbook. The front of the school is for loading and unloading only. Do not park your car and leave it. Pull up as far as you can in front of the school to allow space for others coming into the parking area. Especially, do not allow your students to disembark from the car while you are waiting for the light to change on Arastradero. This is not safe and the police have asked us to remind parents. Thank you for helping us with student safety on coming to and from school.

Terman Middle School PTA Treasurer's Report March 3, 2008

The 2007-2008 amended budget is attached. This amended budget was approved at the last PTA meeting on February 13, 2008. I wanted to highlight the major changes to the budget:

1. Inclusion of interest income line item. This interest is from the 8 month Certificate of Deposit that was opened on July 20, 2007 and which matures on March 20, 2008.
2. Income from Direct Appeal and corporate grants was increased to \$71,200 from \$65,335, thanks to our generous Terman families and their matching corporate programs.
3. A new expense of \$300 for eNews Maintenance was added. This is an annual server charge for Terman's eNews at a site independent of the PAUSD server. This will enable the PTA to deliver the eNews on a timely basis.
4. A new expense of \$500 for Library Acquisitions was added to assist in restocking our library book inventory. This will cover the remaining months in the current school year.
5. An additional \$16,500 was allocated to technology. This additional cost is for the purchase of 18 digital projectors, 32 memory upgrades for the computers in the lab, and other incidental accessories required.

Other minor adjustments were made to expenses actually incurred by the PTA.

On page 10 is the 2007-08 Terman PTA Budget, Amended 2/13/0.

Guest speaker Dr. Philippe Rey

Teenagers and adults have a difficult time communicating with each other. The communication is even more difficult when discussing risky behaviors like sex and substance use prevention/education. Teenagers often think adults won't understand. Adults often think teenagers just don't listen to anything they say. Those perceptions create conflict and inhibit effective communication and mutual understanding.

This Parent Education Event will help participants gain valuable information and additional skills to communicate more successfully with their teen and pre-teen children.

The goal of this interactive training is to increase parents' knowledge of the developmental process of adolescence. Participants will learn about adolescents' physical, social, and emotional development, and what motivates adolescents to behave in various ways, including engaging in risk behaviors such as sex and experimentation with substances. Through this comprehensive presentation, parents will gain the knowledge to communicate more effectively with their children.

The parent education evening consists of a brief, lecture-style training on adolescent developmental issues followed by a general discussion with audience-led questions.

Dr. Rey is a nationally recognized expert in the field of adolescent and developmental psychology. He was born and raised in the French-speaking part of Switzerland and came to the United States to attend college in 1984. His credentials include a bachelor's degree in clinical psychology from UC San Diego and a master's in counseling psychology from National University. In 1997 his doctorate in clinical psychology with a concentration in child and family therapy was conferred by Alliant International University in San Diego. Before pursuing graduate studies and a career in psychology, Philippe graduated from business school in Switzerland.
